4. Welcoming & Introduction

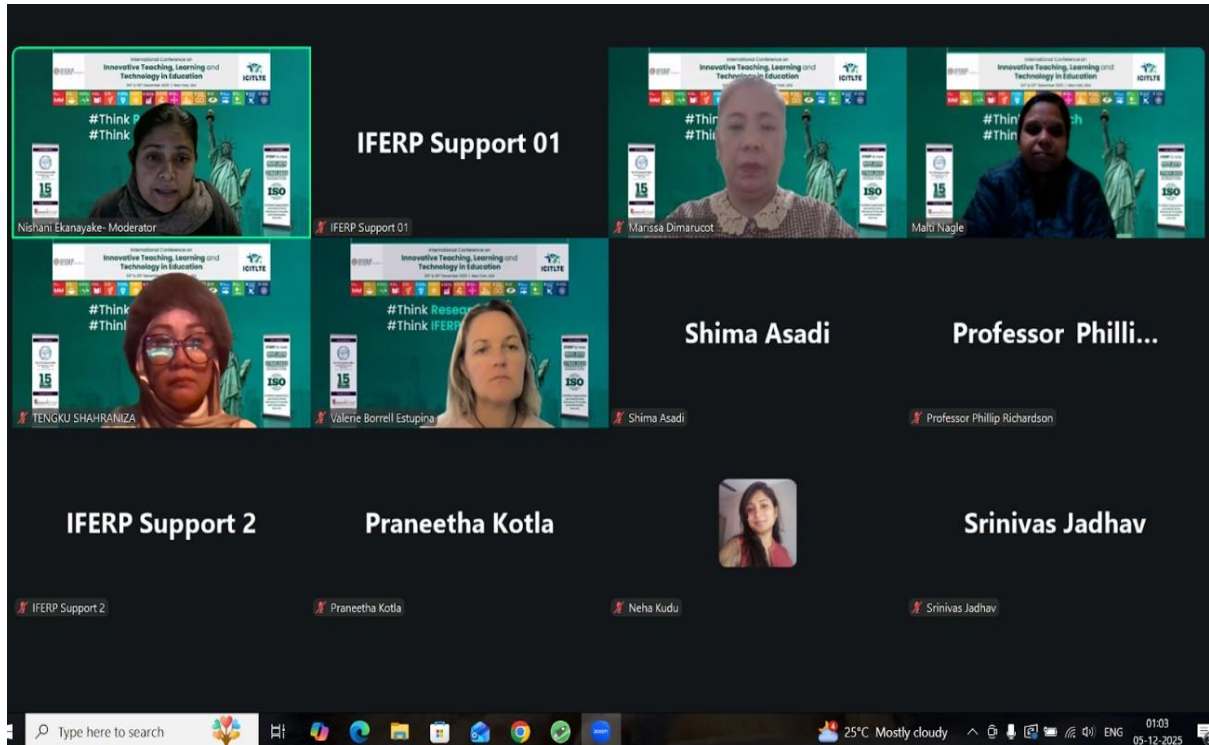

A virtual group photograph session was conducted, capturing the collective participation of speakers, session chairs, presenters, and delegates, symbolizing international collaboration and academic unity.

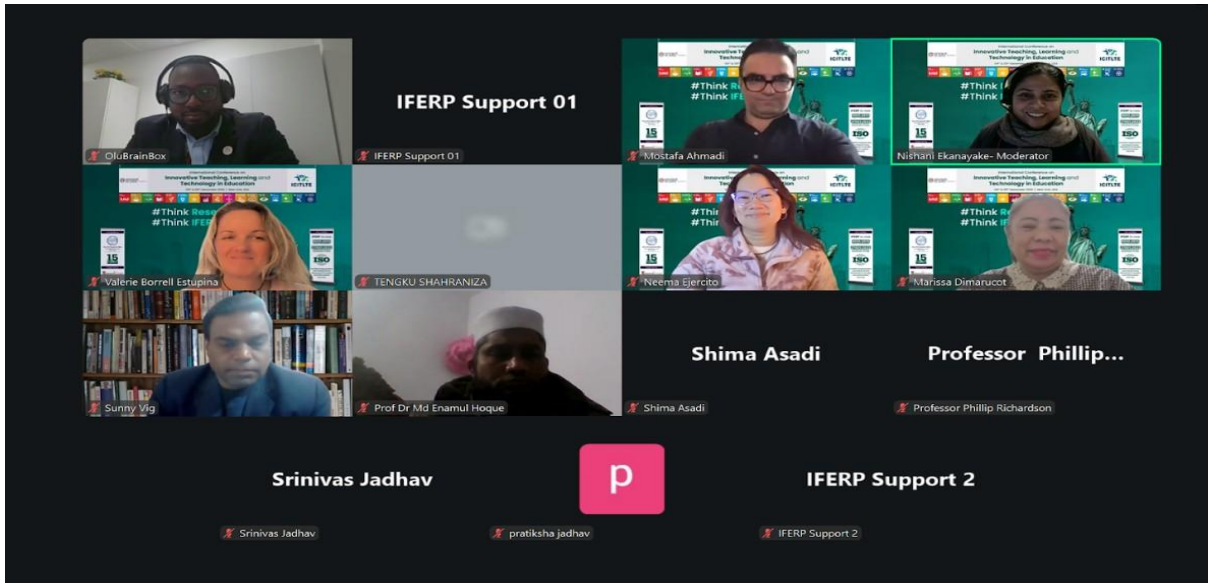


7. Inaugural Programme

8. Conference Proceedings Book Release

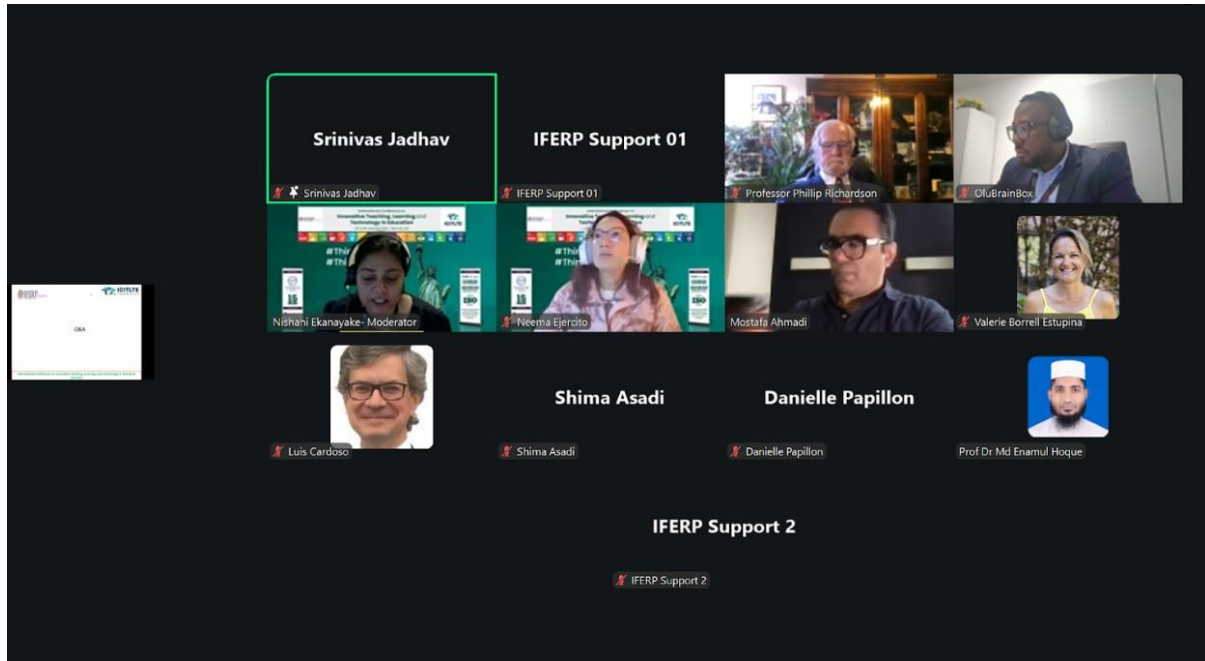

12. Valedictory Function

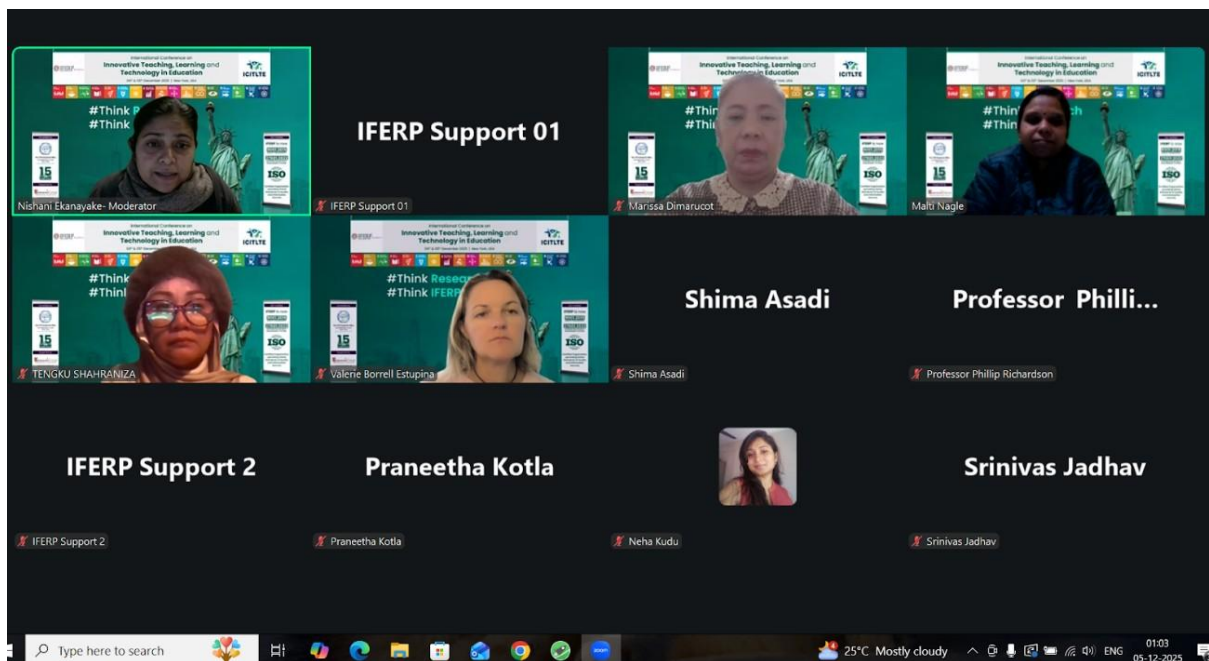
The valedictory session summarized the conference outcomes, key discussions, and future directions. Speakers reflected on the academic value of the conference and its contribution to sustainable education practices

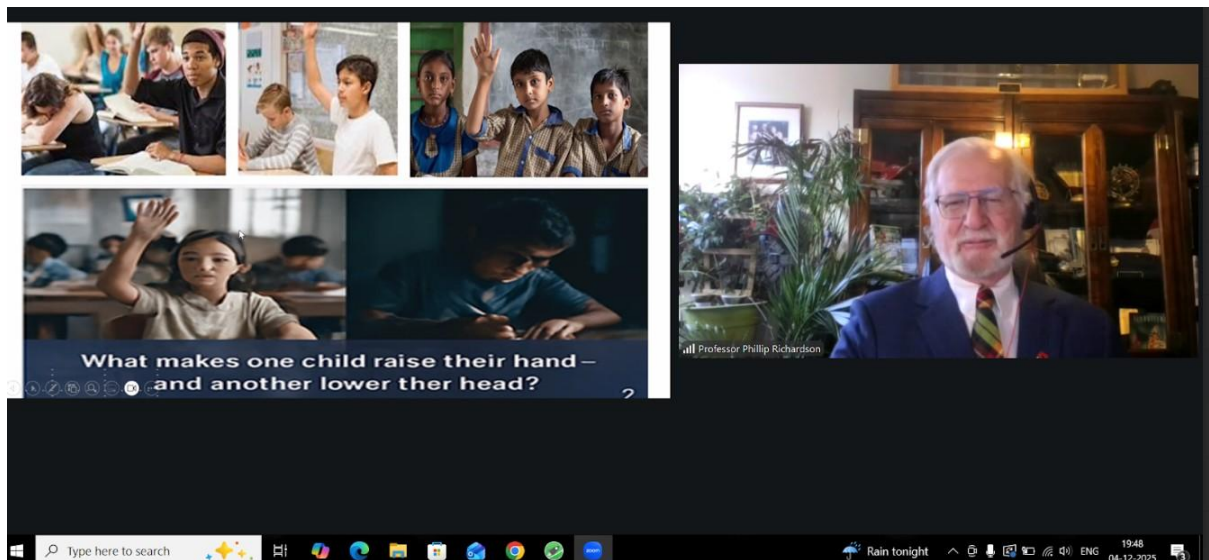
