## **1. Conference Summary**

### **1.1 Conference Overview**

The 8th International Conference on Dentistry and Oral Health (ICDOH-2025) was held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia on 17–18 November 2025, bringing together clinicians, researchers, academicians, and industry experts to exchange research advancements and clinical applications in dentistry and oral health
